

What's the difference between 'comment on' and 'discuss'?



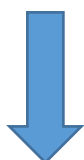
This is what the Operatorenkatalog says:

comment on... / state...	give your opinion, back it up with all the relevant points
discuss	consider all sides of an issue by providing relevant arguments and concrete examples

What does this mean for the structure of my essay?

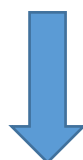
COMMENT ON



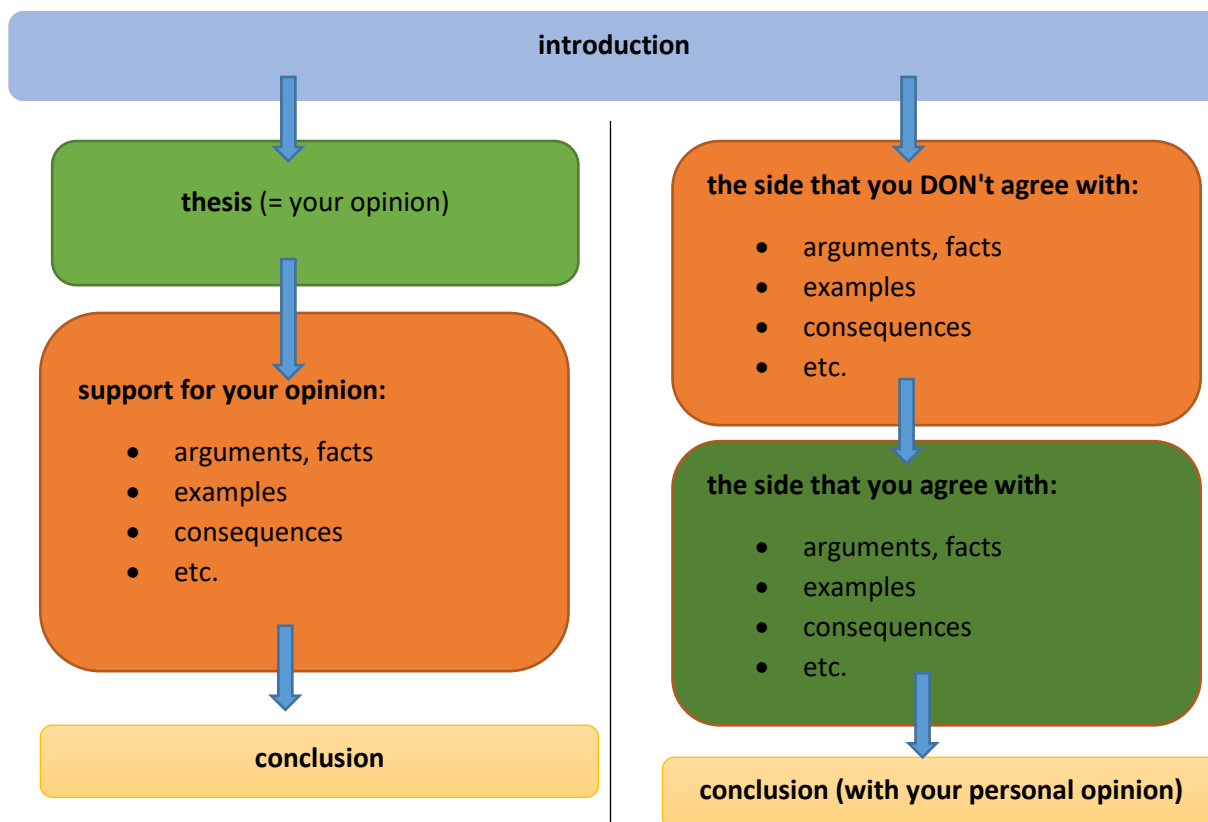
You give your personal opinion (= thesis) and then support it with arguments, facts etc.

There is no need to look at the side you don't agree with!

DISCUSS



You provide arguments for **both sides** of the issue. Then, as a conclusion, you state which of the two sides you agree with.



Please remember:

- Begin a **new paragraph** for each new idea.
- Make sure you use **topic sentences** (= introductory sentences to a block, e.g. *However, there are many people who disagree with this opinion.*)
- Make sure you use **linking words** to structure your ideas.
- Don't just list arguments. Explain them, give examples, show consequences.... your essay will be a lot more convincing that way.
- Remember to write in **formal style** (no colloquialisms, no slang, use full forms (e.g. *he is, they are* instead of *he's* and *they're*).
